

### The Official Opening & Awards will be at NOON on Saturday 3rd May.


Apologies that we recently reported the original opening time of 11am but we were not advised of the change.



The Exhibition attracts thousands of entries from all around the world and has built a strong reputation since its inception in 1861, the year Edinburgh P.S. was formed.

All accepted prints are displayed at their Great King Street premises during the Edinburgh Festivals in August when the exhibition receives thousands of visitors from all over the world, many of whom visit year after year. Also, all accepted images appear in the A4 printed colour catalogue.
